This is the biography of an Anglican priest who played a major part in the development of the Indian Missions of the southwestern BC interior. Except for a stint in Korea and a short respite in the UK, Richard Small spent from May 1884 to his death in May 1909 in missionary service in the Yale, Lytton, Lillooet and Nicola region. This could be called "the Story of Kumsheen" for it is also the story of Lytton (Kumsheen) and the Anglican Mission schools and hospitals of the Fraser Canyon. This biography chronicles the founding of All Hallow's School at Yale; St. Bartholomew's Hospital in Lytton; and St. George's Indian Residential School near Lytton. Our price: \$5.00
